4–6 WEEKS BEFORE: THE LOGISTICS & DIGITAL FOOTPRINT

☐ Digital Subscriptions & Geolocation Assets

Update location profiles on auto-delivery platforms (Amazon, Chewy, grocery deliveries). A stray order shipped to an old address is incredibly difficult to retrieve.

☐ Obscure Utilities & Home Memberships

Schedule transfers for water softeners, propane/oil delivery services, smart home security monitoring, and trash/recycling pickup.

☐ School & Medical File Transfers

Request official physical or sealed digital copies of school transcripts, veterinary records, and dental/medical files rather than relying on automated clinic transfers.

☐ The "Hidden Storage" Audit

Empty out the crawl spaces, attic joints, high garage shelving, and deep basement corners. These are the spaces universally overlooked until the final hours.

2–3 WEEKS BEFORE: THE PRACTICAL PREP

☐ The "Open First" Box Assembly

Pack a designated box with basic tools, box cutters, phone chargers, toilet paper, trash bags, a shower curtain, and phone chargers. Keep this in your personal vehicle.

☐ Hardware Bagging & Labeling

As you disassemble furniture, place all screws, bolts, and brackets into clear bags. Tape the bag directly to a major component of that exact piece of furniture.

☐ Appliance Drainage & Disconnection

Empty, defrost, and dry out refrigerators 24 hours prior. Drain water lines from washing machines and ice makers to prevent foul smells and internal ice structural damage.

☐ Safe Electronics Transport

Take photographs of the back of gaming consoles, TVs, and desktop setups before unplugging so rebuilding the ports is effortless later. Take high-end electronics in your car.

☐ Final Meter Readings

Take clear smartphone photos of your gas, electric, and water meters on your final walkthrough. This serves as undeniable proof for your final utility statements.

☐ **Garage Door Openers & Keys**

Gather all remote openers from car visors, storage boxes, and structural keys. Leave them in a central kitchen drawer for the new occupants.

☐ **Perishable and Frozen Food Elimination**

Consume or donate food stocks. Moving heavy coolers full of thawing items is messy and highly inefficient on transport day.

WINTER MOVING CONSIDERATIONS (CRUCIAL ADAPTATIONS)

COLD WEATHER MITIGATION TACTICS

☐ **Utilities Active overlapping**

Ensure heat is running at both the old and new residences simultaneously. Pipes can freeze within hours in an unheated building during sub-zero stretches.

☐ **Pathway Clearing & De-Icing**

Clear wide pathways through snow and ice. Salt or sand all steps, ramps, and driveways completely. Slick footing drastically slows down professional movers and creates immense safety hazards.

☐ **Temperature-Sensitive Cargo Safeguards**

Electronics, fine musical instruments, houseplants, and liquids can crack or shatter in freezing truck bays. Load these specifically into warm passenger vehicles.

☐ **Floor Surface Shielding**

Snow, slush, and corrosive road salt will destroy hardwood and carpets rapidly. Lay down heavy cardboard layers or plastic runners across high-traffic indoor walkways.
